

**TOWN OF ST. STEPHEN**

**BY-LAW NO. S-7.1**

**A BY-LAW TO AMEND A BY-LAW TO REGULATE THE COLLECTION  
AND DISPOSAL OF GARBAGE AND OTHER MATERIAL**

Be it enacted by the Council of the Town of St. Stephen as follows:

1 Section 4 of the by-law is amended by repealing subsection 4.06 and substituting the following:

**4.06(1)** Garbage containers shall be:

- (a) subject to subsection 2 hereof made of plastic,
- (b) equipped with handles and plastic tightly fitting covers, and
- (c) watertight.

**4.06(2)** Garbage containers shall not be made of wood except that wooden bin containers used as garbage containers at the time of the enactment of this amendment may be continued in such use provided they:

- (a) comply with section 5.06,
- (b) are constructed of solid, attractive wood material, suitably painted or stained, and
- (c) are not unsightly, unhealthful or dilapidated, in the opinion of the Town building inspector, and comply with the provisions of the Unsightly Premises By-law.

**4.06(3)** The standard lidded type garbage container shall have a capacity of not more than 77 litres and weighing when full, not more than 27 kilograms, and when empty not more than 6.8 kilograms.

**4.06(4)** Plastic garbage bags may be used if such are not larger than approximately 57 centimetres by 79 centimetres.

**4.06(5)** Cardboard or paper containers shall not be used as residential garbage containers unless specifically manufactured and treated for that purpose.


2 Section 6 of the by-law is amended by repealing subsection 6.05 and substituting the following:

**6.05** Garbage containers shall be placed for collection on the evening prior to or the morning of the scheduled pickup and shall be removed from the edge of the street within 8 (eight) hours of collection.
