Job Description

The Mechanic performs a variety of skilled tasks involved in preventative maintenance and repair of the Municipal District of St. Stephen's (MDSS) fleet of vehicles and equipment.

Nature and Scope of Work

- Under the direction of the Supervisor II, performs scheduled servicing, preventative maintenance, and repairs, in both the shop and the field, on a variety of MDSS fleet vehicles, construction and turf maintenance equipment, trucks, trailer, standby generators, machinery, and tools.
- Inspects vehicles and equipment, diagnoses and troubleshoots mechanical, electronic or electrical malfunctions, and undertakes corrective action.
- Repairs and performs regular servicing on engines, transmissions, brake and steering assemblies, power train, electrical and electronic systems, charging, hydraulic, PTO, and fuel systems on a variety of vehicles and equipment.
- Maintains and repairs small to medium sized engines and small tools (i.e., chainsaws, tampers, blowers, hydraulic tools, lawnmowers, pumps).
- Maintains and repairs winter road maintenance equipment including truck mounted sanders and all related controls.
- Prepares, carries out and evaluates preventive maintenance schedules for all MDSS vehicles and equipment.
- Assists in the development and review of specifications for new vehicle and equipment acquisitions.
- Provides emergency field assistance to disabled vehicles and equipment.
- Maintains detailed records, prepared reports and other documentation related to equipment inspections, repairs, and service.
- Shares technical expertise and provides information/training in the operation, care and maintenance of serviced equipment and vehicles.
- Maintains an awareness and understanding of current and emerging technologies related to this trade.
- Works in compliance with all safety policies, procedures and WorkSafe regulations.
- Participation in on-call rotation and overtime as required.
- Maintains equipment and tools used in the performance of work in a clean and safe manner.

Performs all duties related to the Works Department involving streets, sewers, parks, labour work, and other duties as required.

- Thorough current knowledge of industry maintenance standards, practices and operating regulations related to the work.
- Working knowledge of computerized mechanical diagnostic tools.
