
Largest Program in the under 20,000 population category up from 3rd in 2023

SWIMMING LESSONS

In 2024, we taught 585 people in our public swimming lessons, compared to last year’s 341 swimmers. This is before taking into account our new ASAP-2 programming for children, which saw a further 360 swimmers, for a total of 945+ swimmer registrations in 2024!

HOW DOES 2024 COMPARE TO 2022 & 2023?

This is a significant step forward for our department when compared to 2023. 2024 marked a more than 160% increase in FWS swimming lesson programming, nearly tripling our total number of swimmers taught! 2024 also saw an increase in our overall provincial standings as a training partner in every category by at least two places. 2024 saw 172 leadership and first aid certifications, compared to 149 in 2023, a roughly 15% increase.
